

Happy Holidays



These stars have been suggested by our Sanibel Student MJ. After a few trials we found this the most economical way to cut triangles. We have included the pattern in various sizes. They are very versatile. You can make Tree Ornaments, Napkin Rings, a Christmas Wind Chime or even

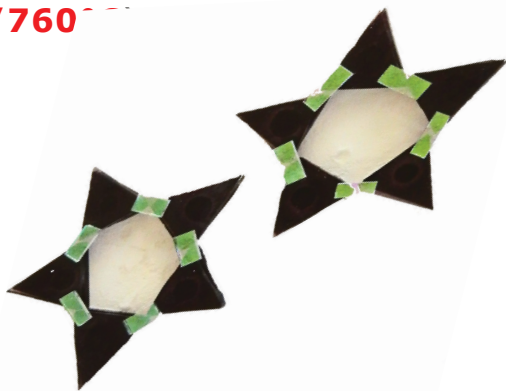
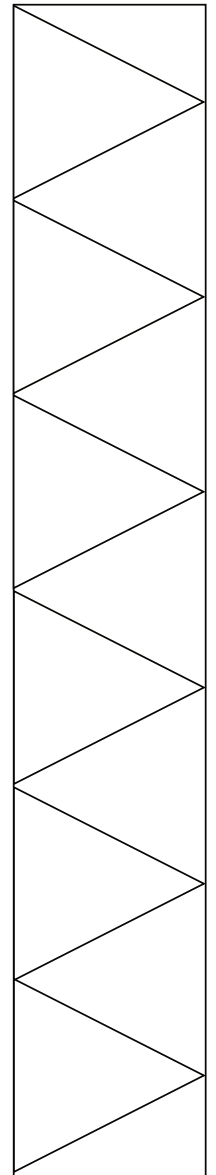
Jewelry with them.

First you cut a strip 1" wide and 6.1" long. Use the pattern to the side and mark the lines on your glass.

For each star you need 10 triangles if you want to use it as a napkin ring. The double layer makes a more even looking triangle. Connect the triangles with little rectangular dichroic glass pieces.

Then fire your stars like you would fire your Jewelry Pendant. I fire mine **Full to 1420°F/770°C hold :10** and turn off the kiln.

But if you like to make a light weight tree ornament you could try it with just 5 triangles and fuse it at a lower temperature around **1400°F/760°C**
